**WHAT IS IT?** A flexible, integrated and itinerant program for learning, mentorship and exploration in **Arts** engaging with **Community**, including:

- Workshops and courses covering basic topics and skills (e.g. project start-up, aesthetics and ethics, partnerships, grant-writing, documentation, research, evaluation, facilitation, collaboration, history);
- Seminars with Jumblies artists and guest presenters;
- Internships with the chance to test ideas with community groups;
- Incubation and longer-term support of projects;
- Playgrounds to explore new ideas, forms and collaborations;
- Practicum opportunities for post-secondary students;
- Print and digital archives and resources.
